I. Submissions

Submissions are produced by outside authors and include Academic Papers, Commentaries, and Correspondence.

1. **Academic Papers:** Academic papers involve an analysis of a topic or set of related topics in health, ethics, or policy. Papers are comprehensively researched, well developed, and address one of the many areas which TuftScope publishes about. Please see the *Guidelines for Academic Papers* for more details.
2. **Commentaries:** Commentaries are shorter than papers and are usually single issue accounts, utilizing significantly less research. Commentaries discuss a range of topics that includes bioethics, healthcare, biomedical issues, public health, etc. Please see the *Guidelines for Commentaries* for more details.
3. **Correspondence:** Letters to the Editor may be published in TuftScope either in print or on the *Tuftscope* website. Letters should address papers, commentaries, or articles written within the journal. Please see the *Contact Us* section of the website for more details.
